Vice Chairman Scott called the regular meeting of the Warren County (Pequest River) Municipal Utilities Authority to order at 7:35 p.m. The meeting was held at the Authority's Administration building located at 199 Foul Rift Road, Belvidere, New Jersey.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

At approximately 7:40 p.m., Mr. Rosenberg moved and Ms. O'Connor seconded to adopt Resolution #15-57, to enter into an executive session to discuss contract and personnel matters. All in favor, motion carried.

At 8:20 p.m., Mr. Kiszonak moved and Ms. O'Connor seconded to return to open session. All in favor, motion carried.

Mr. Kiszonak made a motion to give Ms. Kaspereen a one-time bonus of \$1,000, for the extra work accomplished over the course of the year. Ms. O'Connor seconded. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Ms. Kaspereen thanked the Board.

CONNECTION FEE SUBCOMMITTEE REPORT

Mr. Piazza, who chaired the subcommittee, explained the purpose of the subcommittee was to establish an equitable system for charging connection fees. The State has an expansive list of different types of potential users who might want to connect to a sewer system. However, the subcommittee felt their flow numbers were unrealistic. The Authority afforded the owner of the LaTorre Plaza a 50% reduction from the State numbers. Therefore, the subcommittee is recommending the Authority use the State's numbers with a 50% multiplier for all applicants. At last month's meeting, Mr. Donati distributed a draft of different tables for calculating EDUs for connection fees that are more realistic then using DEP criteria. He prepared a resolution for consideration by the Board.

Mr. Kiszonak asked if the resolution allows for a special circumstance that may come up in the future that no one thought of at this point. Mr. Donati pointed out Note #2 at the end of the table (Appendix D) which provides for such an occasion.

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Mr. Piazza moved to adopt Resolution #15-58, which amends the Rules and Regulations of the Warren County (Pequest River) Municipal Utilities Authority to incorporate revisions to the Authority's Service Rules for modification of the method used for calculating connection fees (Section 5.09 and Appendix D). Ms. O'Connor seconded. All in favor, motion carried.

CFO'S REPORT

Mr. Olshefski prepared and presented a resolution for amending the FY2015 Budget, for reclassification of budget amounts among expense categories.

Mr. Niece moved to adopt Resolution #15-59, which amends the FY2015 Budget for the Warren County (Pequest River) Municipal Utilities Authority for reclassification of \$26,300 among expense accounts. Mr. Rosenberg seconded. All in favor, motion carried.

As presented by Mr. Olshefski at the Annual Rate Hearing, there was a proposal to reduce the user rates for 2016. The proposed residential rate would be reduced from \$12.39 to \$11.12 per billing unit. The proposed industrial rate would be reduced from \$24.78 to \$22.24 per 1,000 gallons. He also presented the proposed billing for 2016.

Mr. Niece moved to approve the FY2016 billing, as presented. Mr. Rosenberg seconded. All in favor, motion carried.

Mr. Olshefski presented the resolution and certification for adoption of the FY2016 Capital and Operating Budgets. The DCA approved the budget.

Mr. Piazza moved to adopt Resolution #15-60, for the adoption and certification of the FY2016 Annual Operating Budget and Capital Budget/Program. Mr. Niece seconded and the motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Mr. Olshefski presented the resolution for the amendment of the Authority's Rules and Regulations to incorporate annual adjustments to Appendix C.

Mr. Piazza moved to adopt Resolution #15-61, for the amendment of the Authority's Service Rules to incorporate the changes in user fees set at \$11.12 for residential users and \$22.24 for industrial users per Appendix C. Mr. Niece seconded. All in favor, motion carried.

Mr. Rosenberg moved to adopt Resolution #15-62, retaining the current connection fee rate of \$6,642.00 per EDU for FY2016. Mr. Niece seconded. All in favor, motion carried.

Ms. O'Connor moved to adopt Resolution #15-63, authorizing the appointment of Nisivoccia & Company, LLP, to provide the professional services of auditor for FY2016. Mr. Piazza seconded. All in favor, motion carried.

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GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

Aside from discussion in Executive Session, Mr. Tipton had nothing further to report.

ENGINEER'S REPORT

Mr. Donati commended the Board for reducing the user rates.

His report was included in the agenda packets.

Sewer Extensions: The owners of the Oxford Textile property contacted Mr. Donati for information on sewer capacity at our Oxford STP, connection fees, and any other fees. Mr. Donati informed the owner that there is about 220,000 gallons per day of available capacity at this time. Their proposed development would generate approximately 97,000 g.p.d. He also provided them with other fee information.

Oxford Upgrade: Substantial Completion was deemed to be November 19, 2015. Mr. Donati prepared and presented a resolution for the Board's consideration.

Ms. Napolitani moved to adopt Resolution #15-64, authorizing utilization of the Oxford WWTF by issuing a Certificate of Substantial Completion, dated November 19, 2015, for Contract #12-01. Mr. Kiszonak seconded. All in favor, motion carried.

Final Completion is the next step, which is when all the punch list items are completed.

Tomar submitted payment request #23 for \$207,970.70, which CPE has recommended for payment.

The Authority must determine the scope of work needed for the work removed from Contract #12-01 by Change Order #5, plus some additional items requested by DCA, and possibly other miscellaneous items. Mr. Donati recommended using the Trust for this work. Mr. Wauhop and our operators will get together with CPE to discuss the rest of the work. The Upgrade Committee will be consulted. Recommendations will be brought before the Board by the end of January 2016.

AUTHORITY CONSULTANT

Mr. Wauhop distributed his report prior to the meeting.

Belvidere plant: He recapped maintenance items performed during the month. In the anoxic zone, a mixer stopped working and was sent out for repair and replaced with a spare. Wasting is done over an 8-hour period during the night, which helps keep the flow going through the plant and helps with decant water. At the Water Street Pump Station, the operators removed and rewired the lights for LED lighting. The polymer pump was replaced and is now used on a regular basis to help with settling. Of the 4 meters left over from Change Order #5 of Contract

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#12-01, one was installed at the head of the plant to monitor total influent flow to the Belvidere plant. Nine hundred pounds of sand was added to the sand filter that was lost over the last few years.

Oxford plant: Mr. Wauhop recapped maintenance items performed during the month. The new disk filters were cleaned and serviced. New sludge judges were made for the two new clarifiers. The outdoor light poles were sold via online auction for \$6,601.00. The operators assisted in installing a new drain collection system around the new garage and it was also tied into the grate collection system.

Under general business, work continues on improving sludge thickening at the Belvidere plant. Mike Codis has been attending classes for his S2 license and some of his classmates visited our site. The two former blowers from the Oxford facility were sold via on-line auction for \$1,200. The #6 MCC at the Oxford plant is now fully enclosed to protect it against extreme cold temperatures. The bypass road was re-stoned.

As discussed last meeting, Mr. Wauhop presented a resolution to amend the Personnel Policy to include a policy regarding cell phone usage.

Mr. Kiszonak moved to adopt Resolution #15-65, amending the Personnel Policy regarding cell phone usage. Ms. O'Connor seconded. All in favor, motion carried.

Mr. Wauhop also presented a resolution for appointment of our risk manager.

Mr. Rosenberg moved to adopt Resolution #15-66, appointing Sharon Cooper of Public Entity Advocates as our Risk Management Consultant for 2016. Ms. O'Connor seconded. All in favor, motion carried.

Mr. Wauhop requested the Board's approval to contract with AFA Protection Systems for central station fire alarm monitoring of the Oxford facility. CPE obtained three quotes and recommended AFA who submitted the lowest quote.

Mr. Niece moved to contract with AFA Protection Systems for monitoring the fire alarms at the Oxford facility per their quote dated December 3, 2015. Mr. Rosenberg seconded. All in favor, motion carried.

Lastly, Mr. Wauhop requested permission to order a second Kaiser blower for the Belvidere plant before the price increase in mid-January. There is \$21,000 allocated in the FY2016 budget for this item.

Mr. Niece moved and Mr. Kiszonak seconded to order a new Kaiser blower for the Belvidere plant before January 15, 2016. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

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FINANCE (Treasurer)

The bills were reviewed and one bill was pulled from Operating for review.

Mr. Piazza moved that Resolution #15-67 (Certificate No. 353: \$77,108.06) be approved to pay all bills from the Operating Fund, except a bill from R&R Pump for \$367.70. Mr. Niece seconded. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Mr. Piazza moved that Resolution #15-68 (Certificate No. 361: \$44,352.23) be approved to pay all bills from the Capital Improvements Fund as presented, with the exception of the Tomar bill. He deferred to Mr. Tipton on the matter. Mr. Rosenberg seconded. The motion passed unanimously on roll call vote.

Due to outstanding liens, liquidated damages, retainage and a limited remaining contract balance, Mr. Tipton recommended the Authority not pay any of the current payment request #23 at this time. There are still outstanding change orders that need to be resolved. The situation and numbers will be revisited at the next meeting.

Mr. Piazza stated that based on legal advice, he recommended no action be taken on Tomar's payment request #23 this month.

<u>UNFINISHED BUSINESS</u>

There was no unfinished business.

NEW BUSINESS

There was no new business.

PUBLIC COMMENT

There was no public comment.

As there was no more business to come before the Authority, Ms. Napolitani moved and Ms. O'Connor seconded that the meeting be adjourned. All in favor, motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 9:16 p.m.

AMENDING THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE WARREN COUNTY (PEQUEST RIVER) MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY TO INCORPORATE REVISIONS TO THE AUTHORITY'S SERVICE RULES TO MODIFY THE METHOD FOR CALCULTION OF CONNECTION FEES.

WHEREAS, the Warren County (Pequest River) Municipal Utilities Authority (the Authority) has adopted rules and regulations entitled Warren County (Pequest River) Municipal Utilities Authority - Service Rules (Rules and Regulations) pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40:14B-1 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has the right and obligation to change or amend, from time to time, its Rules and Regulations in order that they should continue to remain equitable and reflect the current operating requirements of the Authority; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has determined that it would be beneficial to modify its method for determining Equivalent Dwelling Units (EDUs) for the purpose of calculating Connection Fees; and

WHEREAS, the Authority's professionals have developed a table (Appendix D) to be used in determining EDUs for the purpose of calculating Connection Fees and the Authority has reviewed said table and found it to be equitable and appropriate for that use.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Warren County (Pequest River) Municipal Utilities Authority, in the County of Warren, State of New Jersey as follows:

1. Section 5.09 – <u>Payment of Connection Fees</u> of the Authority's Service Rules shall be deleted and replaced with the following:

"Prior to obtaining authorization from the Authority to connect to the

Regional and/or Local sanitary sewer system all appropriate connection fees must be submitted to the Authority, as outlined in the Schedule of Sewage Treatment Service Charges and Connection Fees, which is set forth as Appendix C to these Rules and Regulations. Equivalent Dwelling Units for use in calculating the Connection Fee shall be determined in accordance with Appendix D to these Rules and Regulations. A certificate of occupancy will not be issued by the local municipality unless and until all connection fees have been paid to the Authority."

- 2. A new Appendix D to the Authority's Rules and Regulations shall be included as attached hereto.
- 3. The foregoing amendment to the Rules and Regulations shall take effect as of December 16, 2015, the date of its adoption by a majority of the Members of the Authority, and this Resolution shall be conclusive evidence of the fact that the amendment was approved by a majority of the Members of the Authority at that time.
- 4. Except as otherwise provided herein, the Rules and Regulations of the Authority shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.

RISK MANAGEMENT CONSULTANT'S AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT entered into this 1st day of January, 2016, between the _Warren County (P.R.) M.U.A._ (hereinafter referred to as AUTHORITY) and __Public Entity Advocates, LLC_ (hereinafter referred to as the CONSULTANT).

WHEREAS, the CONSULTANT has offered to the AUTHORITY professional risk management consulting services as required in the bylaws of the New Jersey Utility Authorities Joint Insurance Fund, and;

WHEREAS, the AUTHORITY desires these professional services pursuant to the resolution adopted by the governing body of the AUTHORITY at a meeting held on _August 20, 2014_and;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants set forth herein, agree as follows:

- 1. For and in consideration of the amount stated hereinafter, the CONSULTANT shall:
 - a) Assist the AUTHORITY in identifying its insurable Property & Casualty exposures and to recommend professional methods to reduce, assume or transfer the risk or loss.
 - b) Assist the AUTHORITY in understanding the various coverages available from the New Jersey Utility Authority Joint Insurance Fund and the Municipal Excess Liability Joint Insurance Fund.
 - c) Review with the AUTHORITY any additional coverages that the CONSULTANT feels should be carried but are not available from the FUND and subject to the AUTHORITY's authorization, place such coverages outside the FUND.
 - d) Assist the AUTHORITY in the preparation of applications, statements of values, and similar documents requested by the FUND, it being understood that this Agreement does not include any appraisal work by the CONSULTANT.
 - e) Review Certificates of Insurance from contractors, vendors and professionals when requested by the AUTHORITY.
 - f) Review the AUTHORITY's assessment as prepared by the FUND and assist the AUTHORITY in the preparation of its annual insurance budget.
 - g) Review the loss and engineering reports and generally assist the safety committee in its loss containment objectives. Also, attend no less than one (1) authority safety committee meeting per annum to promote the safety objectives and goals of the AUTHORITY and the FUND.
 - h) Assist where needed in the settlement of claims, with the understanding that the scope of the CONSULTANT's involvement does not include the work normally done by a public adjuster.

- i) Perform any other risk management related services required by the FUND's bylaws.
- 2. In exchange for the above services, the CONSULTANT shall be compensated in the following manner:
 - a) The CONSULTANT shall be paid by the NJUA JIF a fee as compensation for services rendered, an amount equal to six percent (6%) of the AUTHORITY's 2016 annual assessment as promulgated by the FUNDs. Said fee shall be paid to the CONSULTANT within thirty (30) days of payment of the AUTHORITY's assessment for 2016.
 - b) For any insurance coverages authorized by the AUTHORITY to be placed outside the FUND, the CONSULTANT shall receive as compensation the normal brokerage commissions paid by the insurance company. The premiums for said policies shall not be added to the FUND's assessment in computing the fee outlined in 2 (a).
 - c) If the AUTHORITY shall require of the CONSULTANT extra services other than those outlined above, the CONSULTANT shall be paid by the AUTHORITY a fee at the rate of -0- per hour, in addition to actual expenses incurred.
